Stream Advisory Issued for Cow Creek in Frontenac, Crawford Co. Residents and pets should not enter stream at this time

TOPEKA – The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has issued a stream advisory for Cow Creek in the City of Frontenac in Crawford County, for the area in and around West McKay and Oak Streets. The stream advisory is a result of a force main break near West McKay Street that caused sewage to flow into the creek. The City of Frontenac has now contained the release and is in the process of completing repairs to the break.

Potential elevated bacteria and contaminants may be present in Cow Creek. If you live or have activities near this stream near these locations, do not enter the stream or allow children or pets to enter the stream.

KDHE will rescind the advisory once water samples show no health risk and water contact has been deemed safe.
